Instructions and questions for completing network grid

1. Read “Now we are going to talk about the people in your network who are 18 years or older – people who you interact with, people you receive support from or receive support from you, people you consider to be part of your world. We want you to list up to four people that you are most likely to speak about romantic relationships (your own or others’ relationships) and/or issues in your community. People you mention can attend this congregation, another congregation, or reside elsewhere. Please give us up to four names of people who you are most likely to speak with about relationships and issues in your community.
2. Write the names they provide in the name column (a). Ask the following questions.
3. Go through all the names in the list (up to 4 names). For each person do the following:
 - (b) Ask: “What is your relationship with (name of person)? You can mention more than one relationship. For example, a person can be your aunt, and can also be your health provider.” Write the corresponding code(s) for the relationship(s). Relationships can be family relationship (such as mother, husband, sister, co-wife, etc.) or friend, or it can be a different type of relationship, such as shop-keeper, co-worker, health worker, teacher of the respondent’s children, religious leader, etc.”

- (c) Ask: "Does (name of person) attend this congregation?" If no, "Does (name of person) attend another congregation?" And, if yes: "Where?" If person does not attend a congregation, ask "Does (name of person) reside in Kinshasa or outside of Kinshasa?" Write the response.
- (d) Ask: "How close would you say you are to (name of person)? Very close, close, or not close?" Write the response.
- (e) Ask: "In the last 3 months, have you discussed family planning for you and your partner, for (name of person) and their partner, or family planning in general in your congregation with (name of person)?"
- (f) Ask: "Do you give advice and support to this person to help in their decisions on planning their family, how many children to have, when to have them, and whether and when to use birth control?"
- (g) Ask: "Do you get advice and support from this person to help in your decisions on planning your family, how many children to have, when to have them, and whether and when to use birth control?"
- (h) Ask: "Would you say that (name of person) approves of people using modern contraception to prevent pregnancy or space their births?"
- (i) FOR INTERVENTION CONGREGATIONS ONLY: Ask: "Have you spoken with (name of person) about messages you might have heard about family planning from the Masculinité, Famille, et Foi (MFF) Project?"
- (j) Ask: "In the last 3 months, have you discussed conflict in your relationship with your partner, conflict in the relationship of (name of person) with their partner, or conflict and violence in relationships in general in your congregation with (name of person)?"
- (k) Ask: "Do you give advice and support to this person to help in conflict with their partner?"
- (l) Ask: "Do you receive advice and support from this person to help in conflict with your partner?"
- (m) Ask: "Would you say that (name of person) approves of husbands yelling at, insulting, or beating their wives to discipline their wives?"
- (n) FOR INTERVENTION CONGREGATIONS ONLY: Ask: "Have you spoken with (name of person) about messages you might have heard about violence in romantic relationships from the Masculinité, Famille, et Foi (MFF) Project?"
- (o) Ask: "In the last 3 months, have you discussed gender roles such as who does and time spent on household chores and childcare in your household, gender roles in (name of person's) household, or gender roles in general in your congregation with this person?"
- (p) Ask: "Do you give advice and support to this person to help in male partners being more involved in doing household chores and childcare from their partner?"
